The charity has to generate income to cover the running costs of the Centre, the playing field and the children's play area. We do this through membership subscriptions, fundraising events and the hire of the Centre for private functions and by regular activity groups and clubs. We do not receive funding to cover our running costs from public bodies.

The PDCC offers a membership scheme which is open to any adult in Palgrave and the neighbouring areas, including Diss. Membership is currently set at £10 per year. As well as helping us to keep the Centre running, the scheme also gives members price reductions for some PDCC events, such as the monthly cinema evenings, garage sales etc.

Did you know that the PDCC funds and produces our village's monthly magazine *The Palgrave Star*? It is delivered by volunteers. *The Palgrave Star* keeps the community in touch with village life and is delivered free to every household in the village.

The Annual General Meeting is open to all paid-up members of the PDCC. It is your opportunity to hear about this year's activities, to ask questions and to make suggestions about future activities.

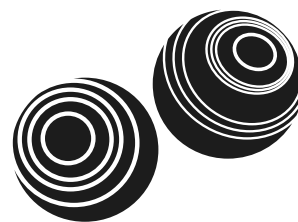
Officers and a Trustee Committee will be elected for the coming year at this meeting.

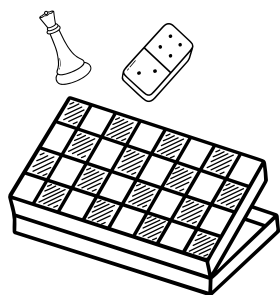

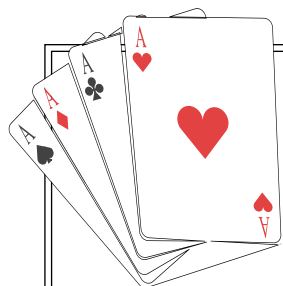

Recycling at the Community Centre

Real Christmas tree recycling

You can take your real Christmas tree to the collection point at the Community Centre to be recycled. Don't forget to remove all your decorations first! Please leave your tree at the collection point no later than **Sunday 11th January** (for collection on Monday 12th January).



Please note: Large trees over 7ft tall or with a trunk thicker than 7cm cannot be collected. Instead, they can be taken to a recycling centre (such as Bury St Edmunds or Stowmarket).

Bottle Bank

Please make use of the bottle bank at the Community Centre. Please dispose of bottles carefully and do not leave glass outside the containers.

Blister packs

These can be recycled in the entrance hall at the Community Centre. When the centre is closed please use the wall-mounted collection box beside the main entrance doors.

Please note: only *empty* blister packs can be recycled. Please check that the packs are empty and that you have removed all medication before putting the packs into the collection box.

The Community Club Bar

The Community Club Bar is run separately from the PDCC, which is a requirement of the Charity Commission. It is run as a members' bar, which anyone over the age of 18 is welcome to join. Children under 16 must be accompanied by an adult. The bar is also available to hire for events held at the Centre.

We open every Friday from 7.30pm - 10pm in the lounge.

News from your Parish Council

The next meeting is 8 January @ 7.30pm in PDCC lounge



The Parish Council extends warm wishes to all parishioners for the coming year, and we look forward to another productive year.

Solar Farm update: The Parish Liaison Group (PLG) met with PS Renewables (PSR) in late November and feel a good understanding has been reached with them. The site construction will begin in earnest at the start of January. Monthly on-site meetings will take place between PLG and PSR. There is a full traffic management plan issued to all contractors advising them to use Lion Road and the A143, not Palgrave village.

If you see any large lorries using Palgrave as a short cut, please try and take a photo of the vehicle, its livery & registration number, date & time of incident, and send it to the clerk. If the vehicle is linked to PSR, they will let us know and reprimand the contractor(s). Please bear in mind that there may be other guilty parties involved, in which case, if we have photographic evidence we can report it via Lorrywatch. Or you can report it direct using the following:

Regarding the mud / stones experienced on Lion Road in November, a local road sweeping contractor is on call to deal with such issues so this shouldn't reoccur.

Devolution and Local Government Reform (LGR) : Devolution is about the creation on one (1) Mayoral authority covering both Norfolk and Suffolk. The term Mayoral Combined County Authority (MCCA) will become well known to us over the next year or so. The Government is mandating that all counties in England will undergo this process. Elections for the post of Mayor have been delayed until May 2028.

Ahead of the Devolution process, the LGR is happening. The Government's statutory consultation on LGR is now open, but you only have until 11 January to respond, if you wish to submit comments on the 2 proposals submitted for Suffolk: the Three Councils for Suffolk case submitted jointly by the District and Borough councils; and One Suffolk, submitted by Suffolk County Council. Both plans are available under our website Devolution tab.

Suffolk residents, businesses and local organisations are being urged to take part in a once in a generation opportunity to shape how council services are delivered for their local communities. More details on our website under Devolution /LGR.

Speedwatch: We are forging ahead with reinvigorating this Speedwatch team and are in discussions with the Police as to our old equipment etc. If you would like to be involved, please contact Keith Charman or the clerk who will pass on your details. We need a minimum of 6 persons for this to go ahead.

Norwich to Tilbury Pylon scheme: Have you strong views about the project. Do you know how close they will be to Palgrave? As part of the work behind getting our comments registered with the Planning Inspectorate, **we need you**, the people of Palgrave, to let us know what you think about the project. There is information on our website under the External Energy projects tab, but you can read more detailed information on the following national grid website:

Please send your comments to the clerk so we can collate the views of Palgravians for future use with the planning inspectorate if we are able to comment further. This would be greatly appreciated and is necessary to show community engagement with the project.

A word from Sarah at Rosedale Bereavement Support

Sarah Howard, Rosedale Funeral Home Bereavement Support Group Facilitator

As a family, this year has brought us many changes. Amongst other things, our eldest son has now flown the nest and the younger, having finished schooling, is now moving onto the next phase in his life.

Whilst it is a cause for celebration to watch your children grow in independence and begin to live their own lives, as a mum it can also be tinged with some sadness. Major life changes are seldom straightforward and are often accompanied by many conflicting emotions.

'Midlife' (I'm giving away my age now!) can feel like a crossroads as you realise that a significant part of your life is over and a different, uncertain chapter is beginning.

Life is full of change, sometimes exciting and self-instigated. Other changes, such as bereavement, can be shocking, unwelcome and out of our control.

Perhaps 2025 has brought you a major life change – house move, retirement, changing job, moving house or a bereavement?

As we know, bereavement is a unique experience and different for everyone.

In addition, some responses to grief can be complicated. Perhaps the relationship we shared with the person who has died was difficult. We may not have been on speaking terms with them. We grieve for what the relationship might have been but now never will be. We may have regrets or unresolved issues that can lead to prolonged grief. One-to-one counselling can be helpful to deeply explore all the other issues involved. **Marriages and relationships within families are not always filled with love and harmony – this is reality.**

For those whose loved one has died from dementia or a similar condition, they may have already started the

grief process when they 'lost' the person they knew, the first time. This can feel like a double bereavement.

If the death involved long, painful suffering, some people can feel relief when it is finally over and their loved one is released. This can be accompanied by feelings of guilt.

A bereavement can also change relationships within families or friendship groups. There may be disagreements about funerals, wills and what to do with possessions. Deciding on the final resting place of a loved one's ashes may also cause fall-outs. At such a difficult time, emotions are raw and I have seen many families torn apart because of a bereavement.

We begin to feel less alone when we meet with others who are bereaved and talk through the issues that many people face.

Local to Norfolk and Suffolk, Rosedale's Bereavement Support Groups are safe and confidential, and provide a safe, trusted place to talk about bereavement and be listened to.
