Palgrave Open Gardens

A reminder for Palgrave's Open Gardens weekend over the Spring Bank Holiday: Saturday to Monday, 25th, 26th & 27th May, 2024, daily from 11am to 5pm.

Palgrave Open Gardens is a special social event bringing people together to socialise and visit some of the spaces and gardens that are not normally open to the public. Twenty gardens, many of which have not opened before, will be open and thanks to their generous owners you will see delightful courtyards, carefully managed acres, and established and newly planted gardens, some manicured and some wild. Look out for plant stalls, art studios, wild flower meadows, a model railway and of course, our special feature this year, **Scarecrows** in gardens and around the village.

Entry to the Gardens will be by ticket only and will cover all three days: programmes will include a map and will be available from the Community Centre 'on the day', costing £6.00 per adult (no charge for children under 16). Not all gardens are open for all 3 days, but all are within walking distance with the exception of one which is on the outskirts of the village.

Teas and light lunches will also be available at the Community Centre.

Mike Webb will once again be exhibiting his work in Longs Farm Barn (by kind permission of Richard and Penny Talboys) on the same days as the Gardens, but please be aware that his opening times are slightly different, 10am to 4pm each day. It should be noted that his work will also be on display over the following weekend, 1st and 2nd June, times as before. Mike's cartoons have been a regular presence in the local press since 1972. His observations and references to aspects of Diss life, together with his wit, have entertained and amused us for over 51 years. This exhibition is partly retrospective but also has fresh new work and a selection of his watercolours.



Parish Council Monthly Update

Next meeting: 9 May at 7.30pm, PDCC lounge.

Parish Council update: We have 1 parishioner wishing to be co-opted onto the Parish Council at the May meeting. This will only leave 2 vacancies but we urge anyone who is interested in getting involved, to come forward and join the PC. The more diverse our members, the more debate on matters and decisions that affect Palgrave. Contact the Clerk or a Councillor for more information. Note the May meeting is the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council (AGM) when various statutory matters must be approved including the appointment of the Chair, which is an annual process.

The Annual Meeting of the Parish (APM) took place on Friday 19 April and we would like to thank everyone who attended and for the reports submitted which can all be read on our website under the Annual Parish Meeting tab.

Litter Pick: A big thank you to the approx. 20 volunteers who turned out on 14 April. Although not as many bags were filled this year, it shows that regular pickers are making a big difference to the village, and we thank everyone, one off and regular pickers for their valuable contributions.

Palgrave Speed Watch: We are still hoping to resurrect a Speed Watch team in the village as we have the equipment sitting unused in storage. Please do not be put off by thinking you have to commit to the same time each week – the more ad hoc the better so traffic is caught unaware. We will be asking to borrow the ANPR device which will automatically send warning letters to drivers caught speeding through the village, in an effort to deter speeding. It would be wonderful to gather a merry band of volunteers to enable the Speed Watch to be up and running again. If you would like to be involved, please contact the Clerk.

Solar Farms: We don't expect any activity on the Grange Farm site until mid-2025 at the earliest. The Parish Liaison Group, made up of Parish Councillors and parishioners, will endeavour to keep Pace on their toes as we progress through the year and into next year.

We are still awaiting the decision by Mid Suffolk District Council on the Aura scheme which lies between Palgrave and Wortham. No date has yet been set for the planning committee to review the application. With another huge solar farm planned between Mendlesham and Stoke Ash, we will be vigorously fighting the Aura scheme. We urge all parishioners to submit comments as our region becomes one dedicated solar site.

Norwich to Tilbury Pylon Scheme: All residents should have received a pack recently in the post giving the latest updates on the proposals. The current public consultation is open until Tuesday 18 June and we urge each and everyone of you to submit comments. The documents do not refer to the recent ESO East Anglia Network Study, published on 12 March 2024, by The National Grid Electricity System Operator, which was set up to explore if there were better ways to connect offshore wind in Norfolk, Suffolk, and Essex. The report has found potential ways to reduce the need for pylon lines across the three counties and is worth a read. It can be found via a link on the Suffolk County Council website.

The latest proposals can be seen at a Public Information Event at Diss Town Football Club, IP22 4QP, on Wednesday 15 May from 1 – 6pm.

DDNP: Although the Diss and District Neighbourhood Plan is approved and underway, we still need to have a village representative present at meetings to feed back to the PC re any updates etc. If this is an area of interest for you, please get in touch with the clerk as we would love to have you on board. Meetings are few and far between.

Suffolk Highways: The PC approved to have a pedestrian sign installed at the top of Priory Road, near the Lion Road junction. It also approved the installation of a kerb alongside the small strip of grass adjacent to Malt House. Together these schemes will cost approx. £6500 which will be paid for from our own CIL funds if no other funding can be sourced. It's been a bit of a battle with Suffolk Highways to reach this agreement and we have had to back down regarding our request for pedestrian signage near the Denmark Hill / Millway Lane junction.

The PC approved a motion to request a 20mph zone on Priory Road covering the area from Lion Road to Millway Lane. Our paperwork now needs submitting, which will happen in the coming weeks. It doesn't mean that Highways will approve it, but we have compelling evidence of public approval for the proposal and will do our very best to get this plan through. The cost is expected to exceed £10K which we will have to pay for, again from our CIL funds.



Head back across The Ling and pick up The Field footpath, about 5 miles was all dryish last week. Look forward to seeing you all. Coffee at the Angel or wherever preferred at the end of the walk.

<u>Margaret T's walk - 21st May - Wetheringsett 5.25 miles, no stiles. Normal leaving time from Palgrave as it is only 20 minutes away. Parking at the Village Hall in Wetheringsett village, nearest post code is IP14 5PH. Easiest route is on the A140 via Stoke Ash then turn off at Brockford. When entering Wetheringsett the church will be in front of you, just turn right and the hall will be found a very short distance on your right, it is easy to pass the entrance as you cannot see the sign until you get to it. Wetheringsett is set on the heavy boulder clays of High Suffolk and we will enter wooded and ancient forest areas and pass its many small greens and medieval cottages. Mainly natural grass verges and quiet country lanes and we will walk past the Light Railway Museum but unfortunately their coffee shop will not be open on a Tuesday so we can find somewhere for those who wish to take refreshments.</u>






