Code Of Conduct

Palgrave & District Community Centre expects a high level of good conduct and food hygiene from its members, employees, volunteers and from all other Centre users.

Code of Conduct

All users of the Centre are required to refrain from using offensive language and behaviour, to respect the Centre and to avoid damage to the building or the property of others.

At all times peoples' feelings must be valued and respected. Language or humour that people might find offensive must not be used, e.g. racist jokes or comments or jokes that are derogatory to someone with a disability.

Patrons creating a disturbance or engaging in disruptive conduct that constitutes a nuisance to others will be asked to leave.

The sniffing of volatile substances, use of illicit drugs and the viewing of obscene and inappropriate material is prohibited.

Smoking is not allowed anywhere in the Centre building.

No one will be harassed, abused or intimidated on the grounds of their race, sex, age, nationality or sexual orientation.

People must be treated with dignity and respect regardless of race, nationality, gender, sexual orientation, disability and age.

Children under the age of 12 must be closely supervised by a responsible adult at all times.

Patrons are required to stay out of the kitchen unless involved in the preparation of food.

And food handling guidelines must be followed when preparing food.
