



#### Blister Pack Recycling: PLEASE MAKE SURE YOUR PACKS ARE EMPTY

This trial scheme at the Community Centre is being well used, but unfortunately many of the deposited packs still have tablets in them. This is potentially dangerous and such packs cannot be accepted as part of the recycling.

#### \* \* IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT YOU PLEASE CHECK THAT THE PACKS ARE EMPTY and that you have REMOVED ALL MEDICATION \* \*

Unwanted or unused medication can be returned to pharmacies so please do not leave medication in the packs that you deposit at the Community Centre.

PLEASE NOTE: the scheme is for blister packs used for tablets which contain a mix of aluminium foil and plastic. We cannot accept the plastic disposable dossett boxes, which are supplied by pharmacies. These can be recycled in your recycling bin at home.



#### Catastrophic Bleed Packs for Palgrave

#### **News from your Parish Council**

The next PC meeting is at 7.30pm on Thursday 13th November in the PDCC lounge.

A Cemetery & Churchyard Clean Up took place on 11 October. Our thanks to the Church for hosting us, enabling the provision of hot refreshments for our volunteers. A hard core of about 15 people turned up, not huge considering the size of our village, but all determined to make a difference and we extend our gratitude to each and every one of them. Work like this can make a large visual impact and should never be undervalued. We would include a group photo except it wouldn't be very clear within these pages! The group concentrated solely on the Churchyard and the Cemetery, always a peaceful place to sit and contemplate life. Thank you everyone for your support.

**School Play area**: We await further feedback from the school before any further decisions are made on this proposed project.

**Village maintenance works** continue with the gates in the cemetery and churchyard being cleaned and preserved as well as the last bench needing an annual clean. A new bench will soon be in situ in the cemetery, replacing the old broken one.

**Parking on Pavements**: Please be considerate of others by not parking on pavements or footpaths. This hinders access for pedestrians, parents with pushchairs and people with limited mobility.

We'll try and give you a clearer insight into the rules and regulations.

Is it illegal? The definitive answer:

The whole of the UK could soon follow London and Scotland in making parking on pavements illegal. The Department for Transport (DfT) announced it's considering bringing the rest of the country in line with the capital's rules – which could land drivers with a £70 fine.

Parking on the pavement is not illegal outside of London and Scotland. You can, however, still get a fine for doing so in some instances, which makes the law quite a grey area. Since 1974, Highway Code rule 244 has stated that drivers "MUST NOT park partially or wholly on the pavement in London and should not do so elsewhere unless signs permit it."


The key things to note here are the words *must not* and *should not*. In London and Scotland, you must not park on the pavement, the '*must*' indicating there is legislation behind this rule and you could receive a fine for breaking it.

Outside of the capital, Scotland, or "elsewhere", the Highway Code states drivers *should* not park on the pavement, meaning it is advisory and not, therefore, backed up by any legislation.

However Rule 242 states: "You MUST NOT leave your vehicle or trailer in a dangerous position or where it causes any unnecessary obstruction of the road."

This is a *must not*, again, meaning if your car is reported or seen by a police officer and judged to be either in a dangerous position or causing an unnecessary obstruction of the road, you could receive a Fixed Penalty Notice. Again, just basic consideration for others is the simplest rule. Thank you!

If you want to join us for the first time from Palgrave, please make contact in advance so we can be sure there will be a car seat if necessary. If you are new to the walk, please ensure sensible footwear and it is advisable to bring a change of shoes if it is muddy.

Unless it's a local walk, for most walks we meet at the Community Centre for car sharing, normally leaving sharp at 9.45am on the 2nd, 3rd and 4th Tuesday of each month but please check the individual walk details below.

#### **November Walks**

## Tuesday 11th – Margaret T. Tharston – LONG STRATTON (NR15 2YG) Leave Palgrave at 9.45am 4.5 miles

Normal leaving time at 9.45am. This is a 4.5 mile walk with one stile. A large part of the walk follows the Tas Valley Way which meanders alongside the River Tas. If there has been a lot of rain, then be prepared for some mud. Parking at Tharston Church, but it is not a large car park so careful parking to fit all cars. Nearest postcode is NR15 2YG but if coming down Church Road, go to the end and turn right to the church. There are no pubs nearby so will see if The Old Ram in Tivetshall can take us.

#### Tuesday 18th – Hilary – KNETTISHALL HEATH (IP22 2TQ) Leave Palgrave at 9.45am to start at 10.15am

4.5 miles

Walk starts from the East car park (at the opposite end from the main entrance). This is free parking but small so we should share transport as far as possible. Mud levels on the day will determine our route but the plan is to head down to the river to see how the summer's drought has affected the area and then move up into the heath and forest areas before returning down to the car park. There will be wild ponies grazing various parts of the reserve, but they are disinterested in humans as they have not been fed by us, and as a result, will keep their distance. Refreshments at the White Horse, South Lopham on the A1066.

#### Tuesday 25th – Diane & Elaine – IXWORTH Leave Palgrave at 9.30am to start at 10.05am

5 miles

This is a walk we have done before and is mainly grassy tracks, no stiles. We do have to cross the A143 twice. 5 miles but there is a short cut making it 4 miles if anyone wants this and also if the weather not kind on that day. The longer walk takes us through Pakenham past the Water Mill. Free parking is available towards the end of the main street through Ixworth village on the left where the library is. Refreshments may be available next door to The Pykerrel Pub but haven't checked this out yet.

#### A word from Rosedale Bereavement Support

I don't know about you, but to me, the world we now live in feels unrecognisable to the one I grew up in. Life seems to be changing at such a pace, I can hardly keep up!

The rapid rise of social media has led to everyone being able to share their own story, making sure their voice is heard and their point is made. Interrupting and shouting others down seems to have become acceptable behaviour on TV and radio interviews and life in general.

As someone working in the field of counselling for many years, I have noticed a subtle change of late. It now seems that in general, whilst everyone wants to be heard, there aren't many people who are prepared to listen.

A big part of my counselling training was learning how to really listen, making sure that the speaker feels truly heard and understood. Listening is such a valuable gift to give someone; all it costs us is our time.

When someone is bereaved, they often want to talk about their loved one. They miss them and are in their thoughts constantly. They don't want them to be forgotten and talking about them can be one way of keeping their memory alive.

Many bereaved people report that often people avoid mentioning their loved one in conversation. Perhaps they want to avoid causing further upset or don't know what to say to make things better? The truth is the bereaved person is already upset and

almost nothing anyone says can make things better!

Grief can also make some people feel very uncomfortable. Perhaps it reminds them of their own past bereavements. Or they prefer to avoid talking about messy emotions, preferring to keep the 'stiff upper lip'.



Of course, some people prefer to grieve privately. We all have our own way of dealing with grief, there is no right or wrong way. However, making time to listen to someone talk about their loved one and their bereavement can provide an outlet for grief, making them feel less lonely and isolated. It also demonstrates respect and helps to build stronger and more supportive relationships.

Perhaps we all need to slow down a bit, respect each other more and create some space to listen.

#### **Better Recycling 2026**

The Government is requiring local councils to implement its enhanced recycling strategy, which aims to improve recycling rates and encourage a more consistent national approach to recycling across England.



To support the Government's strategy, from 2026 Suffolk Councils will be introducing 'Better Recycling', our new campaign to improve the recycling services we provide to residents. As well as the materials we already collect, we'll also start collecting the following from households directly:

- glass bottles and jars
- cartons e.g. Tetra Pak
- food waste (on a weekly basis)

Two of the most frequent questions we get asked are "Why don't you collect food?" or "Why don't you collect glass or cartons?" These changes will ensure all households will be able to recycle or compost more of their household waste.

The changes will also help the environment by increasing Suffolk's recycling rate, reducing the amount of waste that goes into our rubbish bins and decreasing the carbon impacts of Suffolk's waste and recycling collection service.

This is all vital in our efforts to combat the climate emergency and promote a circular economy that ensures precious resources can be repeatedly recycled and reused. It will also help Suffolk play its part in achieving the Government's aim to recycling or compost 65% of our waste by 2035.

#### And that's not all...

Residents can now **recycle their broken electricals** more easily thanks to the launch of new recycling bins in the district.

Mid Suffolk District Council has launched six new, pink, electrical recycling bins.

The nearest to Palgrave is located at Buckshorn Lane car park, Eye

This means that residents can now recycle their small broken electrical items, like coffee machines, kettles, mobile phones, tablets, and anything smaller than a 4-slice toaster. Larger items will still need to be taken to a Suffolk Recycling Centre.

#### **Botesdale Health Centre: Patient Participation Group**

Questions of the month to the Team at Botesdale Health Centre (BHC)

## Q: Why have I not been given an appointment with the doctor I asked for on my anima request?

A: We take into account each patient's preference for the type of appointment and their chosen clinician. However, as part of our triage process, our staff must assess the urgency of each request, determine which clinician is most appropriate, and consider availability. To ensure patients receive the most suitable care, we allocate appointments to the clinician best placed to meet their needs. If the requested clinician is appropriate and available, we will offer that appointment.

However, as we have a diverse team of clinical professionals working alongside our doctors – including Nurses, Urgent Care Practitioners (Paramedics), an Advanced Nurse Practitioner, a Clinical Pharmacist, a Physiotherapist, and a Social Prescriber – we must direct requests to the most relevant clinician. This helps us manage demand effectively, prevent duplicate appointments, and ensure patients are seen through the correct clinical pathways.

#### Reasonable adjustments

Did you know the Equality Act 2010 says all health and care organisations must make changes to their services so they can be accessible to people with disabilities? This includes people with a physical disability or a sensory disability, people with a learning disability or autistic people and people with a long-term condition such as dementia.

Reasonable adjustments can be quite complicated to arrange and sometimes need lots of planning across health and care teams for people who have complex needs. Speak to health and care professionals and tell them about the reasonable adjustments you may or your loved one may need.




