2025 has been a busy year at the **Community Centre!** Regular events have been films, quizzes, bingo, as well as talks and craft fayres. Friday night sees the members' bar at the Community Centre opening its doors to welcome you for a drink and a chat with neighbours you might not even know!

Regular hirers provide us with a whole range of activities and contribute to the vibrancy of our Centre. This year we have been very lucky that Jackie McDonald volunteered her services to set out and help produce The Palgrave Star. The Star is produced monthly by the PDCC and delivered free by volunteers so that every household is kept informed of village activities.

We have all worked hard to put on these events and raise money to cover the running costs and improvements at the Centre.

Talking of improvements – a lot of work has taken place over the last few months, particularly in the redecoration of the lounge bar. Have you seen it? Paint, flooring, fabrics and furniture have been updated and co-ordinated. Thanks go to Donna Duncumb, a former Trustee who steered this project. The patio outside the lounge bar is being replaced, and – less visibly – we have had to carry out urgent repairs to our drains. We have installed improved external lighting and CCTV cameras. Most of this work was undertaken with the help of a generous grant from Mid Suffolk District Council, in recognition of our community work. Thank you very much to them.

Next year we hope to improve the sound system for the cinema and other events, extend the patio and improve the surface under the swings.

Our aim is to provide a welcoming and safe environment for use by you all. Please support us and join in with the fun. Thank you everyone. Happy Christmas and our very best wishes for 2026.


The Community Club Bar



News from your Parish Council

The next meeting is 11 December @ 7.30pm in PDCC lounge



Your monthly update from the Parish Council includes:

We welcome Keith Charman back onto the Parish Council and look forward to working with him. This leaves just 2 vacancies which we are keen to fill.

Solar Farm update: The Grange Farm solar project is well under way with many of the planning conditions met & discharged by BMSDC. They can be viewed on the BMSDC planning portal. Our Parish Liaison Group met the new project managers, P S Renewables, on 26 November and we await an update from that first face to face meeting. We are aware of the recent mud & stones on Lion Road as a result of the project, and will ensure this is cleared / cleaned regularly so as not to cause a hazard to motorists.

There is no update on the Aura Marsh farm project which is not anticipated to start until 2027.

The Lows Footpath: Our immense gratitude once more to the working party gathered together by Heribert's enthusiasm for clearing the Lows footpath from encroaching nettles and ensuring this remains a beautiful walk into Diss. They did an amazing job previously and pulled out all the stops yet again. The work of everyone involved is of huge value.

We are in contact with our District Councillor about clearing away the old barbed wire and fencing near the bridge and are expediting this continuously until we get a resolution - this is a potential risk if anyone stumbles off the path at that point.

We heard recently about a *speeding cyclist* on the path who shouted obscenities to mums with children to get out of his way. Regrettably we have no power to do anything about such incidents. We can only remind everyone that it is first and foremost a Footpath, not a cycle track. Any cyclists using The Lows should technically get off their bike and push, not ride it. They have no right of way and at the very least they should at slow right down when meeting pedestrians. Verbal abuse is not acceptable behaviour by anyone. We can only offer our sincere apologies to the parents who were subjected to this incident.

Speedwatch: We would like to get this up and running again and our new Councillor, Keith, is keen to take this on. If you want to be part of his team, please contact Keith or the Parish Clerk to register your interest, while we determine what needs doing to restart this voluntary group. It's not an onerous task, is done on an ad-hoc basis as surprise to motorists is obviously the key element. Full training is provided by the Police Speedwatch team.





A: No, the length of the questionnaires can't be changed. They are set by the system provider and ask questions which will provide us with as much detail and information relevant to your concern.


You and your General Practice

We understand that getting the right help from your GP practice can sometimes feel a little confusing. That's why we wanted to share a new guide from the NHS called 'You and Your General Practice'. You can find more information on our website: https://www.botesdalehealthcentre.nhs.uk

This guide also helps to explain how you can help your general practice. For example:

- 1. Be prepared. Before an appointment, think about writing down your symptoms, what you are worried about and what you want to talk about.
- 2. Be on time. Being late for an appointment or being unavailable for a timed call-back can affect other patients.
- **3. Cancel if not needed**. If you can't go to your appointment, tell the practice as soon as you can, so that they can offer it to someone else.
- **4. Use the NHS App or website**. If you're confident using smart phones or computers, order repeat prescriptions, and see your test results online.
- **5. Turn on notifications.** If you use the NHS App, turn on notifications so the practice can contact you more easily. Please keep an eye out for messages.
- **6. Order repeat medicines on time**. Make sure you ask for repeat prescriptions on time, so you don't run out, and only order what you need.
- **7. Join the Patient Participation Group**. Your practice has a group of patients who can offer feedback on the services it delivers.





What is a Patient Participation Group?

A Patient Participation Group (PPG) consists of registered patients who collaborate with Botesdale Health Centre to enhance the patient experience, improve services, and find solutions to issues. By bringing together a diverse range of skills, knowledge, and experiences, PPGs also play a key role in developing and coordinating initiatives that benefit both the practice and the broader patient community. 

Better Recycling 2026

The Government is requiring local councils to implement its enhanced recycling strategy, which aims to improve recycling rates and encourage a more consistent national approach to recycling across England.



To support the Government's strategy, from 2026 Suffolk Councils will be introducing 'Better Recycling', our new campaign to improve the recycling services we provide to residents. As well as the materials we already collect, we'll also start collecting the following from households directly:

- glass bottles and jars
- cartons e.g. Tetra Pak
- food waste (on a weekly basis)

Two of the most frequent questions we get asked are "Why don't you collect food?" or "Why don't you collect glass or cartons?" These changes will ensure all households will be able to recycle or compost more of their household waste.

The changes will also help the environment by increasing Suffolk's recycling rate, reducing the amount of waste that goes into our rubbish bins and decreasing the carbon impacts of Suffolk's waste and recycling collection service.

This is all vital in our efforts to combat the climate emergency and promote a circular economy that ensures precious resources can be repeatedly recycled and reused. It will also help Suffolk play its part in achieving the Government's aim to recycling or compost 65% of our waste by 2035.

We'll have more details for you in future issues of the Palgrave Star.

And that's not all...

Residents can now **recycle their broken electricals** more easily thanks to the launch of new recycling bins in the district.

Mid Suffolk District Council has launched six new, pink, electrical recycling bins.

The nearest to Palgrave is located at Buckshorn Lane car park, Eye

This means that residents can now recycle their small broken electrical items, like coffee machines, kettles, mobile phones, tablets, and anything smaller than a 4-slice toaster. Larger items will still need to be taken to a Suffolk Recycling Centre.




